I am happy that we started that process by planning concrete analyses, publications and applications.






## Program


27. – 29. November: Informal meetings among Snowfinch researchers were held in subgroups on different topics.

Almost 40 participants, around 30 in person and 6 online.

Countries represented: Armenia, Austria, Greece, France, Italy, Spain, Switzerland

- 29. November: In an informal meeting, we planned the following concrete next steps:
- Publication: A common review on the past research results, build a population model based on the current knowledge to show what information is missing to predict and assess future population trends and develop mitigation measures. Fränzi Korner-Nievergelt will inform all snwofinch.eu-members and coordinate the publication.
